Enhancing the Trustworthiness, and Comprehensiveness of Wikipedia Content

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Abstract—The approach proposed in this article is aimed to gradually design and build a system of gadgets and instructions for effectively coordinating and synergizing online and offline efforts of users, to guide their contributions towards trustworthy, comprehensive, deeper, and more complete development of all language versions of Wikipedia.

Keywords— Wikipedia, content, trustworthy, small languages' maintenance.

I. THE GAP BETWEEN LANGUAGE VERSIONS

Wikipedia -Imagine a world in which everyone on the planet is given free access to the sum of all human knowledge. —Jimmy Wales

It also means you have access to the entire sum of knowledge created by humanity, in the language, which you own.

Nevertheless, there is a huge gap between the content of language versions of Wikipedia in quantity, even more on quality [1].

It is a big challenge for small languages to stay used in educational, professional and scientific areas [2--3].

Looking at Wikipedia's statistical table of languages (see Table 1) one can see a huge gap in quantity, and even more in quality [3].

Only several languages can be compared to the English Wikipedia, but even they are multi-times smaller in volume.

The volumes of the content of languages lower in rank are even smaller by several tens or hundreds of times [1].

There is a lot of criticism of Wikipedia: poor, not trustworthy. Teachers and specialists, in general, forbid their students to use Wikipedia. Meanwhile, students continue to use Wikipedia. A question arises, why teachers and professors do not correct or develop Wikipedia? But...

It is not an easy task to catch up on where, what, and how one can do, to correct or just add information that is missing.

II. IMAGINE WIKIPEDIA A SET OF THEMATIC WIKIPEDIAS

The approach proposed in this article aims to fill gaps in the content of any language version of Wikipedia, as well as among versions in different languages. The key point of the suggested approach is imagining Wikipedia as a set of Wikipedias on thematic areas, which allows to group users via their knowledge and interests, so as to collaborate more effectively.

It is necessary to gather users/professionals of the same area together around the exact portal, to facilitate their efforts to find exact topics needed to create or update, to provide flexibility for users to coordinate their efforts on enhancing the content of Wikipedia of a certain area by coordinating, organizing, and monitoring the content of that field in Wikipedia.

All required information is maintained in Wikipedia. Which category of articles does the participant edit, which articles are newly written and not checked, or which articles are missing.

III. PORTALS AS A PLATFORM, VILLAGE PUMP FOR THEMATIC WIKIPEDIA

The approach suggested here is gathering all this information about the current situation of the content in a certain area, and its editors and their coordinated actions to put one page, research monthly feedback for generating balanced actions.

Wikipedia already has such pages - thematic portals [4], which can be improved and executed more actively and effectively.

Below is the suggested structure of the Portal page:

- The list of currently missing article.
- The list of feature articles and candidates.
- The list of good articles and candidates.
- The list of upcoming events related to the topic, it can be the date of online meeting or editatons, campaign, etc.
- The list of articles to be reviewed.
- The list of articles to be developed.
- The list of existing articles and their quality evaluation.
- Organization and discussion of articles' review.

- Language connectivity of the portal pages will also make it possible to get acquainted with the work done in more developed portals and to copy the good practices, as well as to discuss and ask for help.
- The list of subscribed members to the certain portal.
- The list of articles under development and/or review for each participant.
- The rules for becoming a member of the portal and who is eligible to vote on article quality.

After the creation or modification of the Portal page in such a structure. We will need gadgets to keep all fields updated, so one can subscribe and get assignments/offers to do.

The only thing left to do is to push, suggest or regularly remind the editors of the relevant category which article is waiting for revision, which ones need improvement. Just as YouTube offers music according to your taste, Netflix offers movies, you may be have interested in. Based on the information on Wikipedia statistics and the feedback of outside users and professionals, the system can improve itself from time to time.

IV. SEMI-AUTOMATIZATION

The creation and renewal of portals, as well as the attraction of contributors into the coordinated work can be semiautomated over time by entering into a dialogue with newcomers and active editors in the given field:

- suggestion to sign as a member of a certain thematic community to the portal page;
- attracting to the portal page and its update;
- suggestion to create an article;
- review a new or recently enlarged article;
- discussing everything related to a certain field of Wikipedia.

V. CONCLUSION

There are hundreds of communities that are devoted to developing their home Wikipedias, believing that it will help to keep using their native languages.

But statistics show that only several language visits are increasingly appropriate for their development.

Users prefer comprehensive ones, where they can find answers to all their requests (searches).

So far, the smaller languages can't be compared to the largest ones.

The approach suggested in this article is a way to work on filling the gap of the content of small languages, so that they can be more developed, even comparable to larger ones. It can help them to reach more visits and, therefore, will keep the language alive in all areas.
